# **PGVP Niche Programmes**

Each year in Term 2, we want to highlight our niche programmes which your child will be going through. They are our Learning for Life Programme (LLP) and Applied Learning Programme (ALP). The ALP and LLP work in tandem and are also inter-woven into the curriculum to ensure that students adopt a "learn for life" attitude and to motivate them to be self-directed and collaborative learners. More importantly these niche programmes help our students grow to be Confident Learners.

• PGVP Learning For Life Programme (LLP) - Building of Character through Outdoor Experiential Learning (OEL)

OEL is our niche and the focus of our Learning for Life Programme (LLP) here in Punggol View Primary School. A key focus of our LLP is to infuse learning and character building into camps for P3 to P6 and learning journeys at each level. Each year, we dedicate a week during Term 1 Week 10 as our OEL Week. During the OEL week, we consolidate our OEL activities for all levels, with emphasis on our R<sup>3</sup>ICH. Values for the different camps.

# • PGVP Applied Learning Programme (ALP) - Effective and Empathetic Communicators (E<sup>2</sup>C @ PGVP)

Our Star Studio @ PGVP is a media performance and recording facility that plays an important role in the school's efforts to develop effective and empathetic communicators. The school's ALP,  $E^2C$  @ PGVP, focuses on communication, collaboration, and information skills and seeks to equip students with effective communicative skills grounded in values and empathy. The school believes that oracy skills are foundational to literacy and will leverage its existing oracy programs to teach students how to listen and speak effectively in a variety of situations. The goal is to boost students' confidence and performance, develop critical thinking skills, and help them become active citizens and effective communicators. The ALP is critical to achieving the school's vision of confident learners and active citizens.

# **PGVP Assessment Policy and Practices**

## **Removal of Mid-Year Examinations**

In recent years, the Ministry of Education (MOE) has introduced several policy changes under the Learn for Life movement to nurture our students to be **confident and resilient learners**. The removal of mid-year examinations for all remaining levels in primary and secondary schools by 2023 is another step towards inculcating **a joy of learning in our students** and is part of our ongoing efforts to move away from an overemphasis on academic grades.

Schools will have more time to design and provide a variety of learning experiences for our students. Teachers can better pace and scaffold learning to the needs and interests of your child, enabling him or her to feel a greater sense of competence in his or her daily learning. Students enjoy more opportunities to discover their interests and strengths as well as to act on teachers' feedback. We believe this will **strengthen students' intrinsic motivation to learn** and help them become **more self-directed in learning**.

In supporting the learning and development of your child/ward, the school is committed in assessing our students holistically and has put in place modes of assessment which are varied and progressive. As such, in PGVP we design assessment:

- with clarity of purpose to gather evidence of our students' progress, and
- to provide timely and targeted feedback to our students to move their learning forward.

We use a variety of non-weighted tests and formative assessments such as bite-sized tasks and daily work (see Student Handbook, pp 24-28). The emphasis here is on consistency and the importance of daily revision to ensure that our students enjoy the learning process. Bitesized tasks and daily work may include class quizzes, short writing and reading assignments, show and tell, class presentations, discussions, in-class work and homework, etc. Teachers will diagnose each student's learning progress from these tests, tasks and daily work. As these are formative in nature, parents/ guardians should not overstress your children with unnecessary preparation.

Parents play a crucial role in helping their children build resilience and develop a passion for learning. The school will continue to partner parents to help children focus on the value of their educational journey and not just the assessment outcomes.

## Assessment Reporting Structures

Our reporting structure will also vary accordingly to ensure that the time set aside for PTC is meaningful and beneficial. During PTC, our teachers will help you to interpret, understand and use assessment information to support your child's learning. The conversation during PTC will give you the opportunity to make sense of your child's learning progress and together with your child's teacher, support your child through acting on feedback given.

In 2023, our parents will receive information about your child's learning progress from Term 2 to Term 4 through the various reporting structures listed below.:

## <u>Common Day Off-in-Lieu for all staff</u>

Ref: MOE's Press release on 19 Oct 2022 on the 2023 School Terms and Holidays

Previously, whenever a Public Holiday falls on a Saturday, Monday will be a school holiday but our Support services will remain open. From 1 Jan 2023, all staff in the school will go on off-in-lieu on Monday when a Public Holiday falls on a Saturday. This will allow our non-teaching staff to be able to spend time at home with their children during this designated school holiday. <u>Please note that all Student Care Centres, General Office and KCare will be closed on this designated Common Day Off-In-Lieu (Common DOIL)</u>. In 2023, we have one such Common DOIL - Hari Raya Puasa, which falls on Sat, 22 Apr 2023. All school services will not be available on Mon, 24 Apr 2023. School will resume on Tue, 25 Apr 2023.

## <u>R3 – Additional Support for P6 Students</u>

As mentioned during our Principal's engagement session with P6 parents, and shared in the notification, PGVP/105/2023 (24 Feb 2023), our school will continue to give emphasis to its key areas of focus in the holistic development of our students. This year, we will continue to use the Happy Hall periods (Tuesday and Wednesday) to engage P6 students meaningfully in the different subjects. Teachers will also be using this pocket of time to revisit topics and skills taught. To ensure that we instill the value of punctuality and also to ensure that your child is able to reap the full benefits of the additional support, they are strongly encouraged to report to their class by 7.25 am daily starting from Term 2 Week 1 (21 Mar 2023).

## Mother Tongue Language (MTL) Fortnight

The MTL Fortnight is an annual program organised for students aimed at bringing joy to learning their Mother Tongue Languages (MTL) and to learn more about their roots and culture through various engaging activities. This year, it will be held from Mon, 20 Mar to Fri, 31 Mar. Students will participate in activities related to traditional art, music, games and costumes. This program provides opportunities for students to actively learn beyond the textbooks and classroom teaching, embrace their MTL and stay rooted in their culture. It deepens their learning and improves their ability to use their MTL, enabling them to apply what they have learned in authentic settings.

## Anti-Bullying Week (27 – 31 Mar 2023)

In PGVP, we strive to build a culture of care among students. Students are taught the R<sup>3</sup>ICH values and are given platforms to demonstrate these values. Every year, we reinforce and emphasise the value of care to our students through our Anti-Bullying Week. They will also be taught how to be an *Upstander* and be exposed to the various help-seeking measures available. We seek your support at home to reinforce the importance of showing care and harmony amongst schoolmates.

## <u>NAPFA Test (P6)</u>

The conduct of NAPFA test for P4 and P6 students will resume this year after a 2-year hiatus due to COVID. Our P6 students will be undergoing their NAPFA test in May.

- 1.6km : Mon, 8 May Fri, 12 May
- 5-stations test : Thu, 18 May

Our students have been practising hard during their PE lessons to progressively build up their fitness level. The test comprises a 5-station test as well as a 1.6km run/walk component. While the 1.6km run will be conducted during curriculum time, the 5-station tests will be conducted after curriculum time.

Finally, Fri, 26 May 2023, the last day of Term 2 is designated as Eat-With-Your-Family-Day for Singapore. All workplaces are encouraged to close early to enable parents to return home to have dinner together with family members. We hope that you are also able to have a nice meal with your family on this day. Our General Office will also close early at 5.00 pm.

Our Muslim community have just started their month of Ramadan. I would like to take this opportunity, on behalf of all our staff, to wish our Muslim families a blessed month of Ramadan and Selamat Hari Raya in advance!
