## **Understanding the Edusave EAGLES Award in our school**

### What is the EAGLES Award?

The Edusave Award for Achievement, Good Leadership and Service (EAGLES) is a yearly award given to recognise primary school students' leadership qualities, excellence in non-academic activities, and their service to community and schools.

### What's New?

With effect from 2024, EAGLES has been enhanced to recognise students with consistent and exemplary demonstration of Emerging 21st Century Competencies (E21CC). These are important skills your child needs for the future, such as:

- Thinking creatively and solving problems
- Understanding different cultures and being a responsible citizen
- Communicating well and working with others

### Who Can Receive the Award?

*For Primary 4 to Primary 6 students:*

Students can be recognised in four areas:

- Leadership skills
- Service to school and community
- Achievement, having represented school in competitions, exhibitions, conferences, or performances recognised by MOE
- 21st Century Competencies

*For Primary 1 to Primary 3 students:*

- Students can receive the award for showing strong 21st Century Competencies

### How Does the School Choose Award Recipients?

We look for students who consistently demonstrate these qualities through various school programmes, including:

- Our Active Learning Programme (ALP), which develops effective and empathetic communicators
- Our Learning for Life Programme (LLP) which focuses on outdoor learning activities that build character
- Critical, Adaptive and Inventive thinking programmes (CAIT)
- Co-curricular activities (CCAs)

### Why These Changes?

We understand that our children will face different challenges in their future due to changing technology and an increasingly connected world. This award helps recognise and encourage the development of skills they'll need to succeed and contribute to society.

### **Reporting of PE Assessment at PGVP**

Since last year, we have made some positive changes to how we assess and report on your child's Physical Education (PE) performance. Here is a recap.

#### For Primary 3 to Primary 6 Students

Instead of giving final grades at the end of the year, we have a more comprehensive way to track your child's PE journey:

- We have created a portfolio for each student that shows their progress throughout the year. This includes both day-to-day observations and formal assessments, giving you a fuller picture of your child's physical development.
- You will be able to see not just what your child has achieved, but also how they are improving and what skills they are developing. This helps us identify both strengths and areas where they might need more support.

#### For Primary 1 and Primary 2 Students

- We use the Holistic Development Profile (HDP) to report on your child's progress at the end of each term.
- Your child will also have a portfolio showing their ongoing progress.
- The reports will use qualitative descriptors (QD) to explain how your child is doing in different areas of PE.



We believe these changes will help your child develop a more positive relationship with physical activity and focus on their personal growth rather than just grades. If you have any questions about these changes, please feel free to reach out to your child's PE teacher.

### Attendance and Temperature Taking Exercise (ATTEx)

*ATTEx : Wed, 9 Jul 2025*

To help us stay alert and keep everyone safe and healthy, our school will be conducting the **Attendance and Temperature Taking Exercise (ATTEx)** on **Wednesday, 9 July 2025**. This exercise will be done in the classroom after students arrive in school. All students will need to take their own temperature using their **personal thermometer**.

#### *Kind reminder to parents:*

Please make sure your child brings a working **personal thermometer** to school every day, especially on the day of ATTEx. Thank you for your support in keeping our school safe!

### National Day Celebrations

Our school will commemorate National Day on Fri, 8 Aug 2025 with a morning of celebrations. We encourage our students to come dressed in red T-shirts with school shorts and school shoes on that day. If they do not have a red T-shirt, they may come in their PE attire. All students will be dismissed at 10.30am on 8 Aug 2025. Please make the necessary arrangements for your child's dismissal. More information will be shared in a subsequent notification.

### P1 & P2 Lower Primary Games Day

The lower primary games day will be conducted on Fri, 8 Aug 2025 after the National Day Celebrations.

### School Closure for PSLE Oral and LC

The school will be closed for P1-P5 students on the PSLE Oral Examination (OE) and PSLE Listening Comprehension (LC) days. P1-P5 students **do not** need to report to school on those 3 days. Instead, they will be having e-learning from home. The Student Care Centre will also be closed during PSLE LC day and from 1pm on PSLE OE days. Students are not allowed to enter the school before 1pm on PSLE OE days.

### Teachers' Day Celebration

Teachers' Day falls on Fri, 5 Sep 2025 and the school will celebrate Teachers' Day on Thu, 4 Sep 2025. Students will be dismissed at 10.30 am. on that day. Please make the necessary arrangement to facilitate the earlier dismissal timing. We want to encourage students who want to show their gratitude by creating their own gifts for their teachers (e.g. notes, letters, cards or crafts). We seek your understanding not to give expensive Teachers' Day presents as teachers are generally unable to accept such gifts. Parents and teachers will also be able to pen your gratitude and wishes online. More details will be shared later.

### **Safety, Wellbeing and Security**

Ensuring school safety is of utmost importance to protect the safety and wellbeing of students and staff in the school. We want to take the opportunity to share with you our safety vision and mission which has also been communicated to your children.

In PGVP, we emphasise to our students that safety is everyone's responsibility and all of us have a part to play to help create a safe and secure school for all. You may refer to the Student Handbook for details about our school's Safety Policy. Rest assured that as a school, we will adopt all reasonable and practicable measures to mitigate foreseeable accidents from taking place.

### Safety at the Pick-up and Drop-off point

Ensuring traffic safety, particularly at our school porch, is a very important area of traffic management. This area is heavily utilized by our school, excursion buses, as well as parents picking up and dropping off their children. We would like to once again remind all parents that **parking or waiting on our school porch/driveway is strictly prohibited.** This designated space is for pick-up and drop-off only. We have prominently displayed "No Parking/Waiting" signs in this area to inform drivers, and we extend our gratitude to parents who have complied with this rule.

When picking up your child from SCC, CCA or after school activities, if your child has not yet arrived at the designated pick-up point, we kindly request that you drive to either available white or red lots and wait for them there. You are to remain in your vehicles while waiting. Only proceed to drive to the pick-up point when you spot your child. Do note that we have observed some parents waiting at the pickup point with their engines on. We appreciate your cooperation in arriving and picking up your child on time.

#### Changes to the dismissal arrangement at Gate 5 during wet weather

Please note that with effect from Semester 2, during wet weather, classes going out via Gate 5 will be diverted to Gate 6.

#### New traffic arrangement outside school

You may have noticed that the road outside the school has been diverted due to the on-going MRT construction. A new traffic junction has also been created. Due to the new traffic arrangement, do drive with greater care and cater for extra time when sending your child to school, especially during wet weather.

#### Wearing of PE Attire to Ensure Thermal Comfort for our students

To ensure the thermal comfort and well-being of our students during this hot season, they will be allowed to wear their PE T-shirts and shorts on all school days instead of their school uniform. This arrangement will be in effect until the end of Term 4.

We hope that this measure will help students stay cool and comfortable throughout the day. As always, please help ensure that your child's PE T-shirt is always neatly tucked in. Your continued support in maintaining a smart and respectful school appearance is much appreciated.
