School Uniform and PE Attire for 2026

In the past year, due to the warm weather, we have given the option for students to wear their PE attire to school instead of the regular school uniform. Moving forward, for 2026, we will maintain the same policy to allow students to wear their PE attire to school if they find that the weather is too warm.

To help parents better manage school uniform and PE attire, we will make it optional for P1 and P2 parents to purchase school uniforms for their child as they have PE and PAL lessons on most days of the week.

Update on Mobile phone and Smartwatch Usage for 2026

Increasingly, smart devices are being used by parents to monitor their children's movements to ensure their safety and security. Therefore, from 2026, we will allow students to bring mobile device and smartwatches to school. However, all students must abide by the following conditions of use for such devices:

- Mobile devices must be switched off whilst in school. The switched off devices must be kept in a ziplock bag provided by parents.
- Smartwatches (except the POSB Smartbuddy) must be switched off whilst in school. The switched off devices must be kept in a ziplock bag provided by parents.
- Mobile devices and smartwatches may only be switched on and used in the designated phone use area outside the General Office or at the school gate during dismissal.
- Mobile devices and smartwatches are strictly prohibited from being used for any form of digital recording in the school premises.

Failure to comply with the above conditions may result in the confiscation of devices and disciplinary actions. The school reserves the right to enforce these rules to maintain a safe and conducive learning environment for all students.

Students are also to be responsible for properly safeguarding their mobile devices. The school will not be held responsible for any loss or damage to their devices.

2026 Class Allocation Policy and Offering of Higher Mother Tongue Languages at P3 & P4

There is no change to our Class Allocation Policy. As a reminder, you may refer to the following information. Your child will be allocated to his/her new 2026 class at the end of the year. Our school prepares for the annual class allocation of students guided by a set of class allocation guidelines. Fundamentally, our class allocation guidelines aim to:

- strengthen holistic development, self-discovery and engaged learning,
- customise the learning experiences of similar profile of learners in the class,
- increase social diversity in the classrooms by having mixed-progress groupings, foster peer relations across different progress groups,
- reduce the perceived stakes of examination and
- preserve class identity during progression by not regrouping the students at the end of every level (See Table 1 below).

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** We offer Higher Mother Tongue Language (HMTL) to P3 and P4 students who are coping well with the 4 subjects and display a strong proficiency and interest in the learning of the Mother Tongue Language.*

The class allocation guidelines provide opportunities to inculcate values and soft skills as well as reduce the over-emphasis on academic results. Students may also level up in their academic progress as learning in a mixed-progress setting afford opportunities for authentic and collaborative learning. More importantly, we want to encourage our students to discover and maximise their strengths. Our teachers will be planning lessons to cater to the diversity of learners in their classrooms to ensure that all our students are meaningfully stretched and supported.

Our classes for each level are named after gemstones (Amethyst, Diamond, Emerald, Jade, Opal, Pearl, Ruby and Sapphire) and this in itself reflects our commitment to nurture each and every child so that they can aspire to shine and achieve his/her true potential. We want to assure parents that the alphabetical order of class names is not related to learning progression. Our focus has and will always be on the holistic development of your child.

In P3 and P4, HMTL is offered to students who are coping well with their 4 subjects and display a proficiency in oracy skills and demonstrate a strong foundation in the MTL. In the HMTL lessons, we hope to build on the Mother Tongue foundation established in P1-P2 to deepen and strengthen the learning of MTL at the higher levels. With the introduction of HMTL in the middle primary years, we aim to enthuse our students with joy and passion in the learning of MTL. Not only do we want them to enhance their language skills, but we also want them to gain the cultural knowledge underpinning their MTL. Unlike the P5-P6 HMTL which are assessment based, the P3 and P4 HMTL attainment will be reflected as a non-weighted assessment component in the Holistic Development Profile.

Students assessed to be suitable for the Middle Years HMTL programme will be offered it at the end of P2. Students on the programme will generally stay on for both P3 and P4 HMTL. P4 HMTL students will not automatically graduate to take the P5 and P6 HMTL subjects. P5 HMTL offers will be assessed separately via the P4 Subject-based Banding.

Please refer to the PGVP notification on updates for PSLE 2025; LC and Written Papers dated 3 Sep 2025 (PGVPa/63/2025) for details. Your child would have just sat for the PSLE LC paper on Tue 16 Sep 2025.

The PSLE Written Examination will be conducted from Thu, 25 Sep to Wed, 1 Oct. We would like to wish all our P6 students all the best for the up-coming PSLE examination.

P6 students will be given a 3-Day Study Break as an additional measure to support their well-being prior to the PSLE. The study break will be from **Mon, 22 Sep to Wed, 24 Sep**. There will be a separate notification with more details on the study break.

Children's Day Celebration

Children's Day falls on Fri, 3 Oct 2025, which is a school holiday. We will celebrate Children's Day on Thu, 2 Oct 2025. Please take note that students will be dismissed at **10.30am on 2 Oct**, after the school celebrations.

End of Year Examination (EoYE)

The EoYE for P3-P5 will start immediately after the PSLE Marking Exercise. Please see the appended calendar for the schedule and refer to the separate notification which will be issued shortly. Students are reminded to be punctual for the EoYE. Students who are late may not be allowed to take the examinations. **All absences from exams must also be supported by a medical certificate.**

Parent Teacher Conference (PTC) for selected P1 to P5 students

We will be conducting our E-PTC sessions at the end of the year for selected P1-P5 students and their parents. The final PTC for the year will be carried out in Term 4 Week 10 on Thu, 20 Nov 2025. A link via Parent Gateway (PG) will be sent by the Form Teacher nearer the PTC. You will need the link to book your session. There will be no more PTC for Primary 6 students. Do look out for the notification for more details and the booking process. Thank you for your support in your child's education.

Cultivation of Values

Attendance / Punctuality and Social Responsibility matters

Cultivating the good habit of being punctual in our students is important for their learning and development. Please note that all students must report punctually by 7.30am on all school days. Ideally, students are encouraged to be in school by 7.25am so that they can proceed to their assembly venues in a timely manner. As always, we want to thank parents for your commitment in ensuring your children report to school punctually over the last 3 terms. Their timely presence has enabled them to benefit from the diversity of programmes planned for them.

Any absence from school must be covered by a medical certificate or a letter addressed to the Form Teacher (no more than 5 letters per semester) with a valid reason from parent.

We do encourage the practice of good personal hygiene to minimise the contraction of infectious diseases such as influenza or HFMD. If any family member or your child is unwell, please see a doctor immediately and stay away from school.

Students must continue to attend school after their examinations, including after their PSLE (please refer to the PG calendar for the programmes). Many activities have been planned after the examinations to enrich the learning of our students. There will also be talks from Secondary Schools for our P6 level and these schools will showcase their key programmes and activities.

We would also like to re-iterate that it is **compulsory** for students to attend school during curriculum time. We do not condone students' travel overseas during the term time and will not be able to grant approval for such. Any absence due to travel during term time will be treated as non-valid reason. There will be no make-up session for any activities which the child may miss during his absence.

Safety and Security in the School

Security access to the school

If you need to access the school to meet our teachers, we encourage you to make a prior appointment with the teacher to avoid disappointment. In addition, we will also need you to sign in via the usual Visitor Management System at the Guard Post. **Parents are not allowed to go up to the classrooms**, if you require assistance, please approach the General Office.

For parents with children at our MK, due to security concerns, we regret to inform you that you are not allowed to cut across the school compound to the MK block via our school's Gate 1. Instead, kindly access the MK block via the MK gates (Gate 6).

We want to thank parents who drive for actively displaying the PGVP drive-through decal when you drive in to pick up or drop off your child. Please be reminded that under the Environmental Protection and Management (Vehicular Emissions) Regulations (NEA), it is an offence for the driver of a motor vehicle to leave the engine of a vehicle idling while waiting. If your pick up is delayed, please do not wait at the pick up area with the engine running.



Our car decal is valid until the end of the year your child graduates from PGVP. If you need to apply for a new drive-through decal, kindly access this QR code to apply for a replacement.

Even though Term 4 will be busy, we hope that your child will continue to be engaged in joyful learning throughout. In Term 4, we look forward to working closely with you for the holistic development of your child. We also want to wish you a good break for your family during the upcoming Nov/Dec school holidays.
